



Keeping Patients Safe Contaminated Mattresses

Hospital bed mattresses used on hospital beds. Worn or damaged covers can reveal the mattress surface, which is a high-risk area for contact with a contaminated surface. Follow the steps below to help keep covers in good condition and to identify when mattresses are worn or damaged.



Develop an inspection plan

- Create an inspection plan for all hospital bed mattresses and mattress covers in your facility.
- Check the manufacturer's guidelines for identifying and reporting damaged mattress covers and how any additional conditions are listed.
- Contact the mattress cover manufacturer for any additional actions not covered here.



Inspect

- Regularly inspect the hospital bed mattress cover for any visible damage, such as cuts, tears, or holes.
- Routinely remove the hospital bed mattress cover and check its inside surface. The cover is present if it completely covers the mattress on all four sides and the bottom of the mattress.
- Be aware that it may be difficult to identify damaged mattresses.



Remove and replace damaged covers

- Remove any damaged covers according to your facility's procedures and policies.
- Immediately replace any hospital bed mattress cover to reduce the risk of infection to patients.



Clean and disinfect

- Clean and disinfect undamaged hospital bed mattresses according to the manufacturer's guidelines.
- DO NOT stick needles into a hospital bed mattress through the mattress cover.
