Environmentabanitationincludes a comprehensive understanding of the cleaning and disinfecting processes and application sentral to this understanding is knowledge of the importance of first cleaning environmental surfaces, and then ensuring that they are properly disinfected. Knowledge and understanding of the levels of disinfectant and their purposes, including why, when and how they are used are esser to contact a sesser to contact and the sessential role in infection prevention is critical as well.

Success inenvironmental services management involves the practical knowledge and application of procedures to monitor and manage the facility's supplies and equipment. Managerial oversight includes ordering, stocking and dispensing of supplies, and maintaining, organing for, certain pieces of equipment.

Finally, this week's lesson introduces the example concepts of "greening and sustainability." This week you will begin to consider what your role is, or should be, in the sustainability efforts of the faltity.

However, if you have aspirations to become a leader in EVS, one could argue that from day one these are the things you should be focused without an approved budget and money to fund that budget, your success Environmental Services Management is going to be limited at best. As we progress into this week's lesson on Budgeting and Reporting, we are going to provide an overview of what every EVS Manager needs to know about these essential topics.

The relaionship between budgeting and reporting is a close of Methout suitable reporting measures you will have a hard time justifying your budget request to top management, especially if you are asking for an increase in your budgethout proper budgeting techniques you will have a difficult time supporting the desired cleaning frequencies and other services that your facility requires.

In this lesson we will look at how to develop a budget, key reporting and financial metrics, and how to make sure youra prepared to present and defend your budget request to those with the power to approve it.
